Don't be late, otherwise you will miss lots of learning time!


If you have an intervention, make sure you have registered and chosen your lunch before you go.

Fire Evacuation

If you hear the fire alarm what should you do?

- Calmly push your chair under and line up at the classroom door.
- Don't talk; you might miss an important instruction!
- Your teacher must be at the front with the fire book.

- Follow your teacher to the top MUGA and line up in REGISTER ORDER.



Invacuation

If you are outside and hear the five whistles signal, that means there is an invacuation.

- Calmly head towards the nearest entrance.
- Go inside and walk quickly and sensibly back to your classroom.
- Sit down in your seat and read your book in silence.
- Your teacher will ensure you are all present and radio the office.
- Your teacher will also close windows, pull the blinds down and shut the door for your safety.



You will have 2 PE lessons per week.

You **MUST** have PE kit in school all week in case our PE day ever changes.

Kit: White T-Shirt, black shorts, trainers, outdoor kit e.g. warm sweatshirt and joggers or tracksuit bottoms.

At the end of each week if you have stayed green (no pegs) you will get a frog sticker so that your parents know you have behaved well.


There will also be whole-class rewards. You will find out more about these during our first week back!



Merits and merit cards will continue. We will be awarded merits for growth-mindset and good attitudes to learning as well as fantastic work.

British Value Tree - This is outside Mrs Denney's office. When we nominate pupils for a British Value, we will write your name on a leaf and stick it onto the branch you received the award for.

Role Model - Children can be nominated for a role model award and may be chosen to have afternoon tea with Mrs Denney.



Behaviour system

Stage 1 is a verbal warning from your teacher. They will tell you not to do something.

Stage 2 - If you continue to misbehave then you will get a peg.

Stage 3 - If you get 2 pegs you miss playtime.

*We will remind you about yellow and red cards the first week back.

Homework



Homework is very important.

Your brain is a muscle!
Athletes train every day to exercise their muscles and become good at their sport. Learning is the same! You need to exercise your brain every day and go over things more than once!

You will get homework every Thursday. It is to be completed by Monday.

Spellings will come home every Monday ready for a test the following Monday.

Reading Books

You should be reading for at least 20mins a day. You can change your reading book whenever you wish and as many times as you wish.

We want to see your reading diary at least once a week.

How can **you** ensure that you are ready for Year 4?

- Ensure you keep up practising of all of the **times tables** you have learnt so far (2s,3s,4s,5s,8s,10s). The quicker you can recall these facts the better!
- **4 rules of number** (practise column addition and subtraction).
 - Practise your year 3/4 **spellings**.
 - Enjoy **reading** some books.
- When **writing**, ensure that you are using the basics (capital letters, full stops, joined handwriting).

We would like you to complete some work for your year 4 teacher:

- Create an 'All About Me' hand.
- Follow instructions on the next slide.
- Bring this hand on your first day in Year 4 and we can create a lovely display in your new classroom.




'All About Me' Hand - instructions
