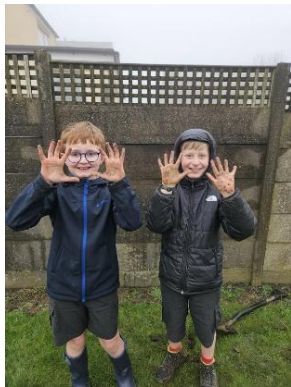

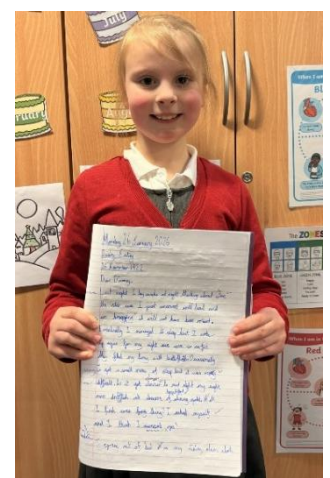

Safer Internet Day 2026

On **Tuesday, 10th February**, our school joined millions of others globally to celebrate **Safer Internet Day 2026**.

This year's theme, **"Smart tech, safe choices – Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI,"** is particularly relevant as our children grow up in a world where technology—from voice assistants to smart toys—is becoming increasingly "intelligent." In school, we will hold assemblies and lessons to help children understand that while these tools are exciting, they are programmed by humans and require us to make "smart" choices.

How you can support at home:

Start a Conversation: Ask your child what "smart" tech they use and how they think it works.

The 'Stop, Close, Tell' Rule: Remind your child that if they ever see something that makes them feel worried or "wobbly," they should stop what they are doing and tell you immediately.

Explore Together: Take a look at the UK Safer Internet Centre's Advice for Parents, which offers practical tips on setting up parental controls and talking about AI.

Download the Guide: For a quick overview of this year's theme, you can access the [Parent and Carer Resource Pack](#) which includes fun activities to do as a family.

Technology moves fast, but by working together, we can ensure our children have the skills and confidence to navigate it safely.
